

Bedlam Session Discussion Questions

Session 1: Creation

1. What is your favourite part of creation? Why?

Read Psalm 19:1

2. How do the heavens declare the glory of God? What does that mean?

Read Romans 1:20

3. What does Divine nature mean? *It means that he is the only creator God.*

4. What does eternal power mean? *It means that there is no end to his power.*
What are some examples of God's eternal power that we can see in his creation?

5. Why is it important to recognize God as the creator?

6. Take some time by yourself and pray to God and thank him for his amazing creations, thank him for creating you, and ask Him to reveal himself to you this weekend.

Session 2: Bible

1. What are some of the things only the Bible can tell us about God?

Read Psalm 19:7-14

2. What does this passage tell us about the word of God?

3. What is sin? What are some examples of sin and evil in the world?

4. Why do you think people don't like to talk about their own sin, the evil that they have added to the world?

5. Do you cherish God's word like gold? What is your personal Bible study time like?
What are some things you can do to make time for God to speak to you through his word?

Session 3: The Gift

1. Why does God have to punish sin and evil? Would he be a just God if he didn't?

Read 1 Corinthians 15:3-4

2. What did God do through sending his Son Jesus? How does Jesus' death on the cross demonstrate both God's justice and his grace?

Read Ephesians 2:8-9

3. How does a person receive the salvation from sin that Jesus has won for us?
4. What does faith mean?
5. Challenge your students: "Could you tell me what the Gospel is and how to receive it in a minute or less?"

Session 4: New Life

A person's faith journey doesn't end at receiving salvation through Jesus. Salvation is only the beginning to a whole new life, an eternal life, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Read Ephesians 2:1-5

1. Why is the language of death and life used in the passage? What does that tell us about the life change that happens when a person accepts Christ as their Lord and Saviour?
2. What is so bad about following our own desires rather than what God wants?
3. What are some of the things in your life that you might need to give up in order to not walk like the dead? Is it worth it to give those things up? How can your leaders help you in that?

Read Galatians 5:22-25

4. What kind of life does the Holy Spirit lead us to live?
5. What do each of the fruits of the spirit mean and what one do you think you would most like to have more of in your life?

Pray that God would fill you with the Holy Spirit as you walk with him day by day.
