- 1. What do you learn about the Bible in this passage?
- 2. How does salvation come to us through the Bible? (v.15, faith in Christ)

Read John 14:6

- 1. What do you learn about Jesus in this passage?
- 2. Where might you continue to learn more about the Bible and Christ? (Go to a church that teaches the Bible)
- 3. How might you learn more about these things next week?

SATURDAY AM

- 1. Read Luke 15:11-32. Which brother do you relate with the most? Why is that? How does the message of a rebel who practically slaps his father in the face, taking his inheritance, affect you? Are you outraged? Do you ever see your own sin against God like that?
- 2. How does the return of this younger son make you feel? Does he deserve it? Where do you see hope in this story? How does this lost son get found? Who seeks him and finds him? What led his father to embrace him? (v.20, compassion)
- 3. Can you think of people in your life who are lost and need to be found? Pray for them.

Read 1 Corinthians 15:1-11.

- 1. Do you believe in the death and resurrection of Christ?
- 2. Do you have any questions related to His resurrection?
- 3. Have you trusted in Jesus to save you from your sin?
- 4. What's your story?
- 5. Do you have trouble believing that his death and resurrection are enough to save you?
- 6. What other things, or people have you been trusting in to save you? (Good works, performance in school or on teams)
 - I. Do you see that these are incapable of saving you?

How does Jesus as the risen Saviour differ from all other religions?

- I. How is this news far better?
- II. Does this change the way we think about life and death? How so? Explain.

- 1. Take one command from this list and ask God to give you the power and desire to obey it.
